OUT OF RANGE TEMPERATURES?

Cold Chain Troubleshooting Checklist

Early troubleshooting measures will decrease the amount of vaccine wastage due to a cold chain excursion.

Maintain vaccine fridge temperatures between +2.0°C and +8.0°C	
□ E	cking the Fridge: Insure the fridge is plugged in Insure the fridge door remains shut and sealed properly Insure that the freezer has no more than 1cm of ice build-up
	heck that the fridge thermostat is properly set lear items that block air circulation inside and outside of the fridge
Chec	king the Thermometer:
	hange the battery (current / minimum / maximum temperatures MUST be recorded first) nsure thermometer is set to the "OUT" position
□ E	nsure the thermometer display is reading "MIN" and "MAX" (not "LO" and "HI" alarm limits) nsure the thermometer display is located outside of the fridge
□ Se	ecure the thermometer probe to the center of the middle shelf of the fridge in an empty vaccine box lear the minimum and maximum thermometer readings after they are documented
How	to Report a Cold Chain Excursion:
tł	all Public Health to promptly report all out of range temperatures including all fridge and / or nermometer malfunctions. During business hours call 705-743-1000 ext. 242. After hours, weekends, and olidays call 705-760-8127 to report.
☐ If	advised by Public Health, complete and fax the Adverse Storage Condition Form with the current 4- reek temperature log to 705-743-2897
□ M a	Nove vaccine (if necessary) and store in a fridge (inspected by Public Health) / cooler that is monitored and maintained between +2.0°C and +8.0°C using a digital transport min / max thermometer Complete a temperature log sheet and refer to the Cold Chain Procedures During a Power Failure poster for instructions on how to transport vaccine

	ontinue to monitor vaccine by keeping a record of all temperatures (current / minimum / maximum), vith times included
	c Health MUST be contacted to determine vaccine stability even if the problem has been corrected. Do use the vaccine or assume wastage of the vaccine without first speaking to Public Health.
